## Health and Social Care

## <u>KS4</u>

The three components of the qualification provide learners with the prospect to cultivate practical knowledge and comprehension of the health and social care industry, at Levels 1 and 2. These components encompass health and social care amenities, barriers to their accessibility, and the competencies, qualities, and principles essential to provide care.

#### **Components 1: Understand human growth and development across**

**life stages and the factors that affect it.** Learners will become familiar with the six life stages of: infancy, early childhood, adolescence, early adulthood, middle adulthood and later adulthood. Learners will investigate how key life events can impact on PIES growth and development across the life stages.

**Components 2: Health and Social Care Services and Values**. This component provides learners with an understanding of the way in which health and social care services meet the needs of the population. Learners will become familiar with a range of health conditions and how they can be managed. Learners will develop their understanding of the skills, attributes and values required to deliver high quality health and social care.

**Component 3: Factors that affect health and wellbeing.** Learners should be able to confidently categorise factors affecting health and wellbeing into the seven areas first introduced in Component 1: physical, lifestyle, emotional, social, cultural, economic and environmental factors.

# <u>KS5</u>

## **EXTENDED CERTIFICATE (equivalent to 1 A Level)**

**Unit 1 Human Lifespan and Development:** This unit develops knowledge and understanding of growth and development, and the experience of health and wellbeing is explored (written exam: 1.5 hours).

**Unit 2** - **Working in Health and Social Care:** Explore what it is like to work in the health and social care sector including the roles and responsibilities of workers and organisations (written exam: 1.5 hours).

**Unit 5 Meeting Individual Care and Support:** An introduction to the values and issues that need to be considered when planning care and support for an individual, including ethical issues and challenges that must be overcome (internal assessment).

**Unit 14 Physiological Disorders and their care**: In this unit you will investigate the causes and effects of physiological disorders as well as examining the investigation and diagnosis of them (internal assessment).
