

Dear families

Welcome to Term 4 and the first signs of Spring are on the way. The sun is finally shining, we hope you have had a restful break and are ready for a busy new term.

A huge thank you to our colleagues who took a group of Year 10s skiing in Austria last week - it was a resounding success, and our students have been given lots of praise for both their skiing and their conduct. Well done to them! We have really appreciated the lovely comments received thanking the staff team and we have shared these.

Year 11s have begun their final set of mock examinations and attendance, punctuality and conduct has been excellent – they are setting themselves up well for the final run in to the GCSE season.

Thank you to all the families that took the time to complete the **Parent Survey** that we sent to you last term. Tewkesbury Academy currently has 1,109 students on roll and had 220 responses to our survey, which represents a response rate of just under 20%. I thought you would appreciate receiving a summary of our learning from the survey, to receive some follow-up information, and to hear some of the outcomes and ideas about next steps.

I am pleased to share that the majority of our students are enjoying a positive time at Tewkesbury Academy - almost 60% of respondents said their child is happy at school, and nearly three quarters said their child feels safe here.

The majority of respondents said their child had not experienced bullying. Less than one third of respondents said bullying had been an issue - and nearly half of them said they had been happy with how the school had dealt with the issue.

Most parents who raised any concerns with the school about other issues said they were happy it had been dealt with effectively.

However, the survey also showed us that there are improvements we can make. For example, the majority of respondents said they would like to know more about what their child is learning and how well they are achieving, and we know too that respondents would like to see greater focus on support for the wider personal development of our children.

Parents would also welcome more information and understanding about approaches to anti-bullying, behaviour management and mental health support.

We value this input from our families and have already begun acting to address these issues.
